Hannah qualified as an Occupational Therapist in 2010, gaining a BSc (Hons) degree in Occupational Therapy from Sheffield Hallam University. She is registered with the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC). She has 9 years post graduate experience working in the NHS, as well as experience working within the private sector as a community based Occupational Therapist with the Neuro Rehab Group.

Hannah has varied experience working with people across the lifespan with a variety of clinical needs. She has worked with children and young adults within neurorehabilitation services, and has worked with adults within trauma and orthopaedics, oncology services and general medicine, including people with brain injuries and neurological conditions. She also completed a placement within a stoke rehabilitation service as part of her training. Hannah worked as a support worker for adults with brain injury before becoming an Occupational Therapist and has always worked using a client centred approach, enabling participation in important activities, and optimising functional outcomes for clients.

Enhancing quality of life and maximising participation is Hannah's approach, assisting clients to get the most from every single day. Hannah has experience of:

- Completing a range of standardised and non-standardised assessments.
- Identifying long term functional needs and setting functional goals and treatment plans.
- Making recommendations for major adaptations, and refering onto other services when required.
- Completing specialist seating and wheelchair assessments in order to provide the most suitable postural support for clients requiring this.
- Splinting and bracing in orthopaedic conditions in an acute setting and reviewing as an outpatient.
- Upper limb assessment and rehabilitation.
- Completing functional assessments of activities of daily living such as washing, dressing, domestic tasks, and fine motor skills.
- Providing functional rehabilitation with children and adults with a brain injury and neurological diagnosis, to include cognitive rehabilitation, developing independent living skills and equipment provision.
- Assessing developmental stages in young children and babies with a range of medical diagnoses and compiling suitable treatment programmes to maximise opportunities for normal development thoughout.
- Developing vocational skills and supporting transitions.
