Dr Fleming has worked for a range of services since 2005 both within the NHS and the independent sector. These have included inpatient, outpatient and community neuropsychological and neurorehabilitation services. He has clinical expertise within the practice of neuropsychological assessment, formulation and intervention.

Clinically, Dr Fleming has previously held positions with several specialist inpatient neurorehabilitation services, including the Brain Injury Rehabilitation Trust (BIRT), Christchurch Group and most recently Steps Rehabilitation Ltd. During his time with BIRT Dr Fleming gained experience in a range of settings including York House Ventures, an inpatient facility specialising in the management of challenging behaviour. He was also the clinical lead at Goole Neuro Rehabilitation Centre where he progressed to the role of Acting Consultant Clinical Neuropsychologist. More recently, whilst employed with Steps Rehabilitation Ltd Dr Fleming held the role of Consultant Clinical Neuropsychologist.

Dr Fleming is experienced in working with clients and family members and has broad experience in leading clinical teams including close liaison with NHS commissioners, social services, NHS and independent sector clinicians, and Case Managers.

Since 2016 Dr Fleming has worked part time independently providing neuropsychological assessment, treatment and rehabilitation services; including Medicolegal expert work in acquired brain injury. He has completed the Bond Solon Civil Expert Certificate.

Aside from his clinical practice Dr Fleming is a Clinical Tutor on the Doctorate in Clinical Psychology Programme at the University of Hull. He is the neuropsychology curriculum lead involved in collaborating with local neuropsychologists and services and runs several of his own teaching sessions. Dr Fleming also regularly supervises trainee clinical psychologist research projects resulting in relevant publications in the field of neuropsychology and brain injury.
