Catherine has worked in the NHS since 2001 and has extensive experience across the neurorehabilitation pathway. She has experience of working with adults with a range of neurological disorders, including traumatic brain injury (TBI), Subarachnoid Haemorrhage (SAH), Hypoxic Brain Injury, Stroke and Multiple Sclerosis (MS), in both inpatient and community settings. Catherine is experienced in the field of neuropsychological assessment and rehabilitation and works with both people who have experienced neurological illness and their families. A key element of her work is supporting people in living with ongoing difficulties after neurological illness or injury. She also provides training and supervision in this area.

Catherine is a member of the Specialist Register of Clinical Neuropsychologists, maintained by the British Psychological Society's Division of Neuropsychology. She is currently employed as a Senior Clinical Neuropsychologist working in an NHS outpatient neuropsychology service and an inpatient Neurological Rehabilitation Unit. She also has significant NHS experience working in Stroke Rehabilitation (inpatient and community), a Memory Assessment team and a Community Brain Injury Rehabilitation service.
